

In addition to running for a position in leadership, you will be able to participate in some of the best leadership development programs Gamma Alpha Omega has to offer. Through our annual National and Regional Conventions, you will learn to grow as leader and as a person.

Supporting your scholastic efforts

Each member must have a 2.5 GPA to be active. Additionally, each chapter requires a certain minimum GPA of its members which maybe higher then a 2.5 but never lower.

Financial Obligation

Dues

Our members pay national dues and fees to support the activities and operations of our organization.

Each chapter also establishes its own cost, dues, and other fees. Chapter costs are determinded by chapter members and are listed in the chapter's bylaws, along with the time and method of payment

Collegiate Finance

Gamma Alpha Omega uses Greek Capital Management for member invoicing and payment processing. Utilizing GCM allows our chapter members various payment options, including credit card, e-check, and check. Members are billed per semester and have several payment options. This includes monthly, semester/quarterly, or pay in full. Parents can set up a parent account through GCM, which allows them to access their daughter's account to view invoices, contracts, and make payments

Licensed Vendors

Purchasing apparel and Gamma is a fun part of joining a sorority! We ask that when you or your daughter purchase these products, it is from a licensed vendor. This helps protect our organization from products being produced that glorify alcohol, hazing, sexism, racism, or any other image that conflicts with the values and mission of our Sorority. 






National Headquarters

Gamma Alpha Omega does not discriminate

Gamma Alpha Omega values sisterhood, diversity, leadership, education, scholarship, Greek Life, members rights, community service and traditions. Gamma Alpha Omega strives to maintain its identity in accordance with tradition and the desire to develop sisterly bonds. Gamma Alpha Omega is committed to diversity and does not discriminate on the basis of race, religious affiliation, color, creed, national origin, sexual orientation, martial status, physical disability, or other characteristics protected by state or federal law. Membership is open to women and

law. Membership is open to women and transgendered persons who identify themselves as women. Males are excluded from membership, as provided by Title IX, 20 U.S.C § 1681 (a)(6)(A), which pertains to social fraternities and sororities.
